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Message from the Chairperson

Dear Members/Friends,

I had the opportunity this year to visit some of the most remote villages in Shilou County, in Shanxi Province. Zigen assists a number of rural villages in Shilou, but I took special interest in visiting and observing villages which have as yet no Zigen support. It was a moving experience for me to see the contrast. I saw eager and diligent students in schools with blackboards so worn that they were no longer black but white: schools which could scarcely provide a stub of a pencil to write with much less a single library book to read. The school buildings were themselves dilapidated and exposed students to hazardous conditions.

In one village in Guizhou, I met a man who broke his leg while chopping wood. He had neither funds nor mobility to go to a hospital and consequently never had proper treatment. At the time I met him he told me he had been lying in bed for two months with the leg still broken; without access to basic hospital care, he faces being crippled for life.

I literally witnessed what a difference Zigen makes. Whereas Zigen-supported villages have slowly but surely made progress in achieving a better standard of life, many remote villages which are without or with little support from outside still simply do not have the means of accessing and affording what is most basic in our lives: basic education and health care.

Despite reforms in education and health care policies that the Chinese government implemented in 2006, the sheer size of China remains a formidable obstacle for some habitants in the remote areas to benefit.

In the cities, the conditions for migrant workers and their children are just as difficult. These workers have made a significant contribution to the development of the cities, but they themselves have difficulties in access to proper basic education for their children. Their children attend makeshift schools whose teachers make a meager 500 RMB a month and thus never stay long. School conditions for migrant workers' children are some time even worse than in the villages.


Countless people in both rural and urban China *still desperately need help*. Despite the recent effort that the Chinese government has put into implementing policy reforms in health care and compulsory education, many people living in remote rural villages still don't have access to the most basic needs: health care and education.

On the other side of the coin, there are people who are more than willing to help. I know that there are scores of young people—college graduates—who care deeply about the predicament in rural China and dream to go straight to the villages and help on-site. The devotion of these people has been confounded by a lack of proper channels to the countryside. Zigen channels the energy of these young people to help in the most effective way they can.

In short, Zigen's potency is two-folds: (1) helping the most needy individuals in villages and cities achieve basic needs; and (2) channeling people who want to help into a position where they really can help.

As my experience during my travels this year has proved, there is still much work to do. We are utterly committed. And you can rest assured that your contribution makes a very palpable difference in individual lives.

Program Evolution

In 2006, Chinese government policy reforms effected shifts in the scheme of Zigen's programs. Zigen adapted its programs and priorities in order to fit with the reforms, while continuing to strive to strengthen the villages from within, which remains Zigen's constant mission.

I. School Education

I-A. Scholarship

In the past, Zigen has concentrated the majority of its education budget on scholarship for basic education. In 2006, the Chinese government introduced fee reforms in Chinese compulsory education for primary and junior high students. To avoid awarding redundant scholarships, Zigen reduced scholarship support by 23%. Through increasing the number of scholarships for vocational high schools by 50%, Zigen is now better able to encourage young people to develop career skills.

I-B. School Facility and Equipment Improvement

- ◆ Dormitories and dining rooms
- ◆ Library books and reading programs
- ◆ Sanitary drinking water
- ◆ Recreational equipment
- ◆ Biogas system
- ◆ Nutritious lunch supplement

With the shift in focus away from basic education scholarships, Zigen was able to provide funding for essential facility and equipment needs in various schools.

The new Merging School Policy siphons children from different villages into one central school. However, there was little governmental funding for dormitory and dining facilities. As a result, some children as young as eight had to sleep in poorly equipped dormitory and cook their meals outdoors. Funding from Zigen enabled students from Sanjiaotian Primary School and Hualong Junior High School in Guizhou and Hubei, respectively, to sleep now in dormitories with beds, instead huddling in classroom corners with lined up desks. Zigen funds also enable students in Fanxiang Middle School to eat properly in a dining room now rather than squatting outdoors.

Library books and reading programs were granted to three schools for migrant workers' children in Beijing and three village schools in QingLong, Hebei. Zigen funded fifteen schools for migrant workers' children so they could purchase recreational items/equipment.

Children at two primary schools in Hubei now have access to sanitary drinking water. Zigen continues to give nutritious lunch supplements to two primary schools in QingLing, Hebei, and a middle school in Shilou , Shanxi. A biogas system was installed in CaiDian Center School in Hubei to provide classroom electricity.

I-C. Curriculum Enhancement

- ◆ Visits to the Capitol Museum
- ◆ Vegetable and fish farming

In addition to the previous years' ongoing support to local ethnic cultural arts and crafts classes, Zigen sponsored four schools for migrant workers' children to visit the Capitol Museum.

WangFeng Middle School in Guizhou initiated a teaching program to grow vegetables and to farm fish on school grounds. Produce was used to supplement the students' meals. Zigen sponsored this program as a pilot project, with the possibility of applying the program to other village schools. These are very small grants which encourage extra-curricular learning.

I-D. Teaching Enhancement

Many rural villages use substitute teachers to keep the village school staffed. As the villagers can only afford to pay meager wages, Zigen subsidized these teachers in 20 villages in Guizhou and Sichuan so that they could adequately feed their own families.

Zigen launched a third Summer English Teacher Training Program, this year in Leishan again. The program is taking the shape of a trainer's training program for local school English teachers.

Zigen's TTPP (Teacher Training Pilot Program) has been working since 2005 to create a handbook for teachers in rural villages. This project was spearheaded because it became obvious that curriculum, textbooks used in the city were irrelevant in the villages. In addition, teachers who themselves came from villages suffered from low self-esteem while they at the same time lacked respect for their village students. Thus far, TTPP has held two training workshops using this handbook, a work in progress. In the first

workshop, fifty-odd teachers from various minority regions came to learn about such topics as the different roles of a teacher, the different needs of students and creating a good learning environment. In the second workshop, comprising the newly written second half of the handbook, teachers learned about parents, community, gender differences, local culture, environment and bilingual education. The revision of the handbook is an ongoing process, and benefits during each workshop from the input of the attending teachers' discussions.

II. Adult Education

Zigen's constant goal is to engender a sense of continuous learning among village adults. Zigen has sponsored and orchestrated conferences where active members of different villages had the opportunity to ask for and exchange advice amongst each other: learning to enrich their personal knowledge and to collaborate with others in developing their own homelands. Zigen hopes that the same cross-fertilization and cooperation at these conferences can trickle down to the general village population level, inspiring villagers to pool their own resources to initiate projects such as collective childcare and markets.

II-A. University Student Summer Program

One of Zigen's goals is to instill university students with a sense of respect and responsibility for their rural counterparts. China Zigen's pilot project, the University Student Summer Program, selected twelve university students to engage in volunteer work in six villages in a poor minority region of Guizhou. Students resided with villagers and shared their meals and labor. The impact of the program was tangible; students were moved to initiate new programs in the villages (in one case, students began an elders' association), and all professed a desire to continue caring for development in rural regions.

II-B. Trainee Sponsorship

Zigen collaborated with a Beijing training organization to sponsor a trainee to practice field-work while sharing daily life with peasants in one of the Zigen-assisted rural villages. This collaboration has enabled Zigen to observe how trainee programs may be run.

II-C. Village Community Libraries

Community libraries funded by Zigen offer villagers a resource to independently research information on practical topics such as agriculture and farming.

III. Health Care

Rural health care has been difficult to sustain as a result of many obstacles. One of the biggest obstacles is the shortage of paramedics caused by meager pay, and inadequate clinic facilities and supplies. In 2006, Zigen provided more than 70 paramedics in Guizhou's LeiShan and TaiJiang Counties with a monthly living cost supplement of 100 yuan, and aided the cash need for medicine turnover in Fang Xiang Township with funds totaling over 10,000 yuan in 2005 and 2006.

In 2006 the Chinese government introduced a rural health care co-payment financing program which is contingent on a pool of subscribers as well as proof of qualified paramedics and clinic facilities. Zigen funding helps villages meet the standards dictated by the government so that villagers may take advantage of the health care subsidies. Zigen's help is four-fold:

- ◆ funding to improve or build clinic facilities
- ◆ funding to subsidize turnover of medical supplies
- ◆ funding for paramedic-training tuition
- ◆ funding to retain paramedics during the unstable pilot period

IV. Village and Migrant Worker Community Development

IV-A. Village Community Development

Zigen's long-standing goal in this area is to foster closer-knit social relationships among village inhabitants through various community activities, thus catalyzing an interest in initiating cooperatives and other self-initiated-and-implemented programs for collective well-being:

- (1) Activities preserving and promoting cultural heritage included ethnic dance lessons/shows, various competitions, and putting together a folk culture museum.

- (2) Everyone’s voice should be heard: Zigen builds up village social groups by, for example, addressing old folks needs—In Henan’s DongGuo village an old folk’s troupe was formed--and emphasizing the importance of their input.
- (3) Preschool “orphan” care: many village children risk being grossly neglected when their parents leave to work in the cities for long periods of time. This concern led to collaboration with the Hong Kong Academy to establish preschool facilities in Guizhou’s Maoping Village.
- (4) Loan to chicken-farming cooperative: Zigen gave a loan to a cluster of farmers to set up a chicken-farming cooperative based on 6 isolated farms in three villages.

IV-B. Urban Migrant Worker Community Development

- (1) Improving quality of life in the city for migrant workers.
- (2) Migrant workers from hundreds of villages converge to booming cities. They have little social life. Zigen has piloted an activity center for migrant workers on the outskirts of Beijing City. With the help of local teachers and expatriate professionals, the center is very active in a small rented 2-room facility. The afterschool program and peer group support opportunities that the centers offer have been greatly appreciated by the migrant workers.
- (3) Encouraging migrant workers (“Grassroots Peasants”) to remember the villages they left and to feel empowered to return and rebuild their homeland.

Zigen is working in partnership with sister organization China Zigen Rural Education and Development Association (China Zigen) , China Zigen shares our mission and goals, and has previously been our partner in project assessment, implementation and monitoring. Many of its directors and members are distinguished scholars and professionals in China, specialized in sociology, economics and agriculture, and environment. With their expertise in rural development, the people behind China Zigen can insightfully address socioeconomic problems in China through in-depth research and exploration of feasible solutions.



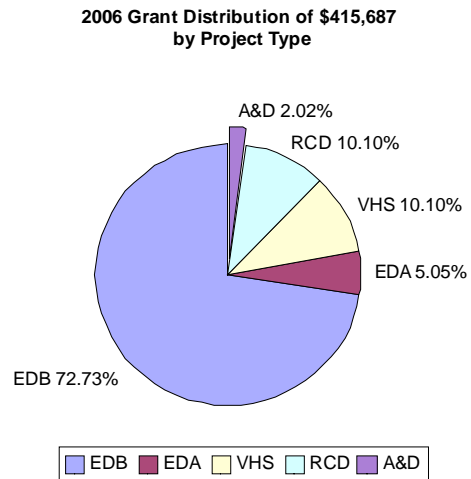

Grants Statistics

I. Project Grants Summary

Total grant increased 5% to \$415,687 in 2006. Investment in education remains our main stay in 2006 with 73% of grants applied to school education. We have, at the same time, increased support to adult education, village healthcare and rural community development. In 2006, the direct expenses for project development, management and monitoring are included in the project expenses.

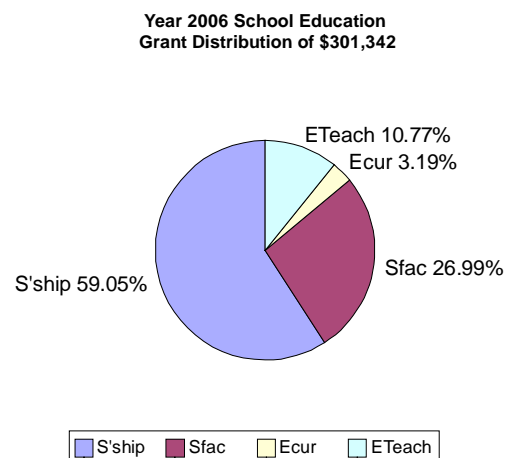
II. School Education Grants Distribution

In response to China Government's new policy for compulsory education in rural areas of China, scholarship per student was significantly reduced. This decision afforded us to continue our support to more than 5,700 students with financial need, with much less funds.

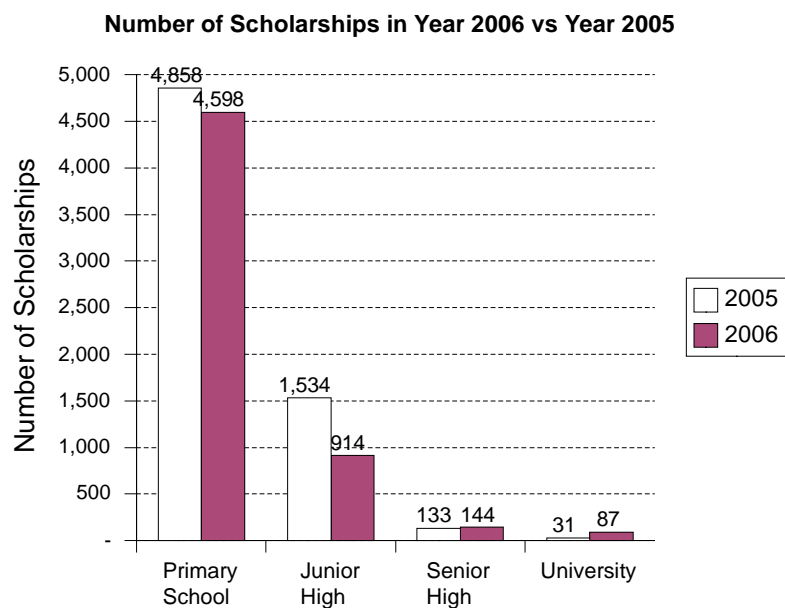

III. Scholarship Breakdown by Type of School

Zigen’s scholarship program includes school fees, book subsidies and living subsidies for primary and junior high school students. For senior high school, vocational high school, college and university students, scholarship provides tuition ad living subsidies. As the central government enforces free compulsory education up to junior high school, Zigen will shift its resources to support more post junior high school education, especially vocational high school education.
